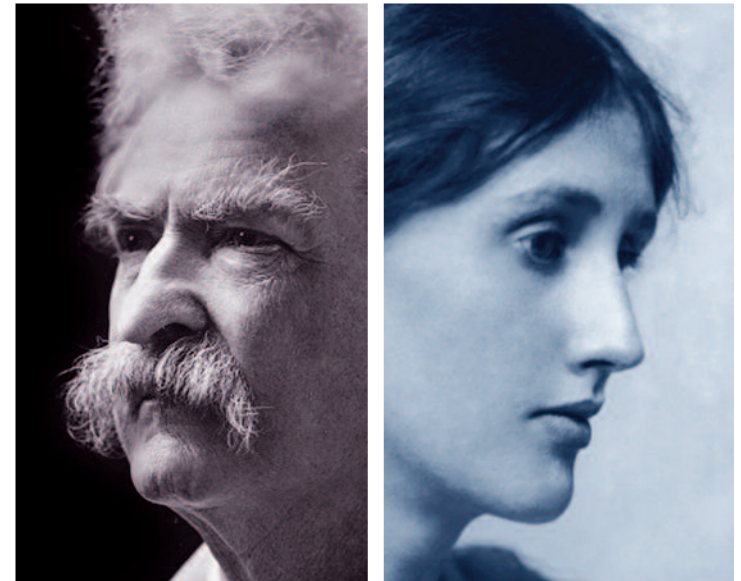
### 1 Get Started

#### Literary Analysis for English Majors

Eng 307 • An introduction to the art of close reading and to the literary analysis of poetry, fiction, and drama



### 3 Choose a Concentration

Your choice of additional courses, according to four areas of specialization:

#### Literature

Intensive study of all eras of British, American, and multicultural literatures

#### Creative Writing

Introductory, intermediate, and advanced training in poetry and fiction writing

#### Professional Writing

Technical writing, writing for business and industry, and writing for non-profit organizations

#### English Secondary Education

Instruction, practice, and certification for future teachers of middle school and high school English



### 2 Literary Foundations

The historical and critical foundations to the English Major for all students, to be taken shortly after Eng 307:

#### British Lit through History I

Eng 321 • A study of selected works of pre-1700 British literature, from medieval and early modern England to the 18th century

#### British Lit through History II

Eng 322 • A study of selected works after 1700, from the Romantic and Victorian era through modernism

#### American Lit through History

Eng 323 • A study of selected works of American literature from 17th century to the present

#### English Studies: Critical Theories

Eng 308 • Advanced training in literary analysis and an introduction to the varieties of interpretation, theory, and critical method

#### English Studies: Rhetorical Strategies

Eng 309 • Advanced training in critical writing and an introduction to the study of classical and modern rhetoric
